

Smart Phone Usage Survey Scoil Bhríde Straffan

Results May 2024

Summary

The document presents the results of a survey carried out by the Parents Association of Scoil Bhríde Straffan regarding the primary school-aged children owning smartphones and the need for support in navigating the online world safely.

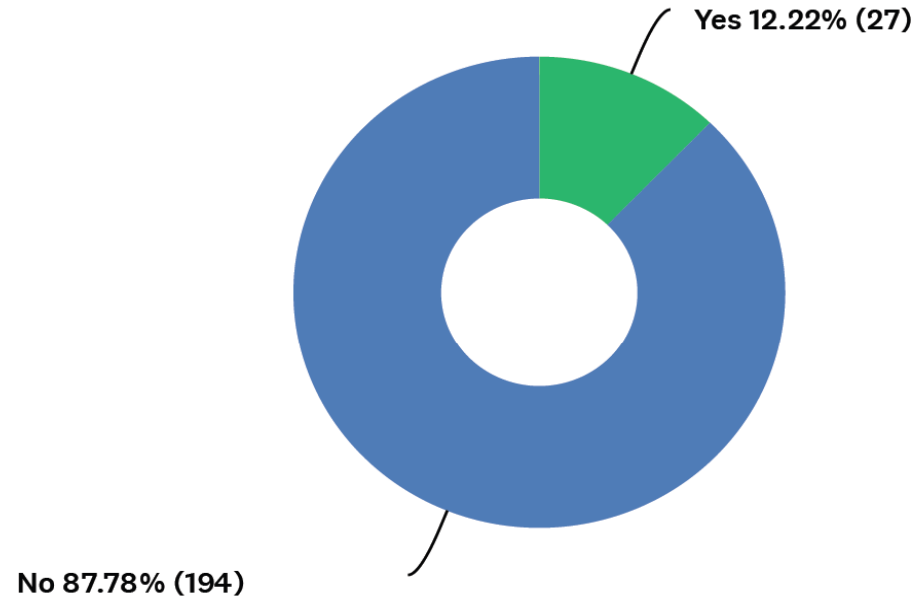
- In response to the question of whether children should own their own smartphones, the majority of respondents (87.78%) answered "No", while a small percentage (12.22%) answered "Yes".
- Regarding the voluntary agreement on smartphones for children, a significant majority (78.64%) expressed their willingness to be part of such an agreement, while a smaller percentage (21.36%) declined.
- When asked about ways to support them in assisting their children with online safety, the majority of respondents (78.08%) suggested education sessions for children, followed by education sessions for parents (54.79%). A smaller portion (22.37%) indicated that they were satisfied with their current approach to phone usage.

Overall, the survey indicates that a majority of respondents are against primary school-aged children owning smartphones, but are open to voluntary agreements and educational support to ensure safer online experiences for their children.



Q1 Do you think your primary school aged children should own their own smartphone?

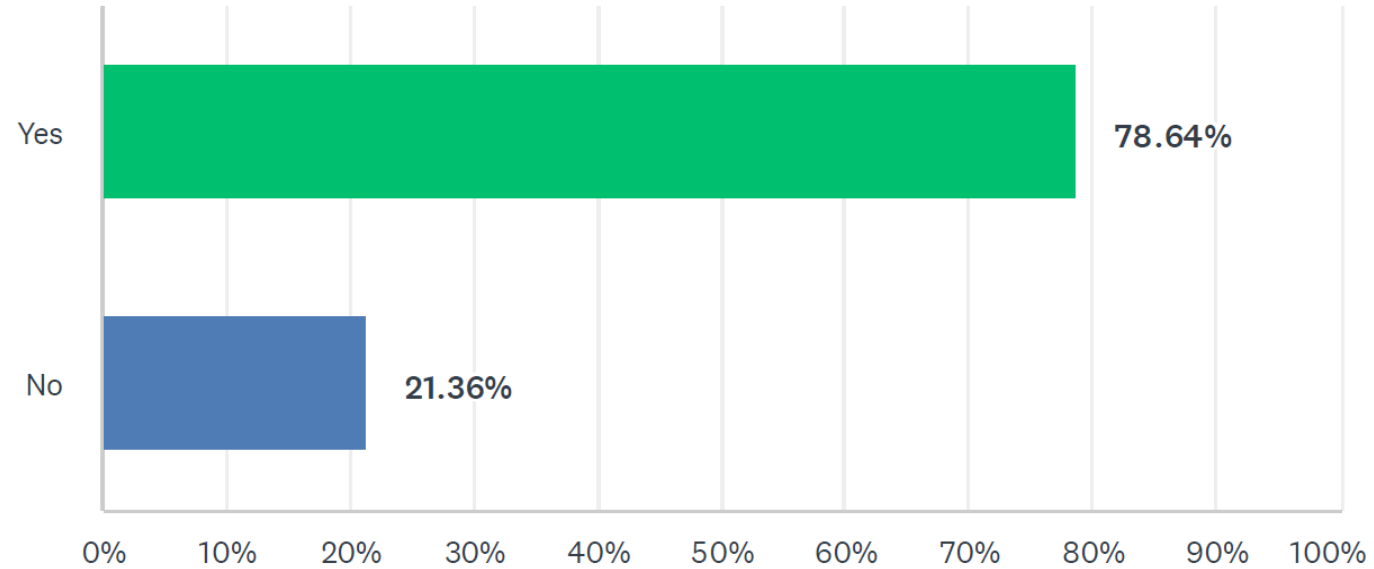

Q2 Do you want to be part of a voluntary agreement regarding smartphones for your children?

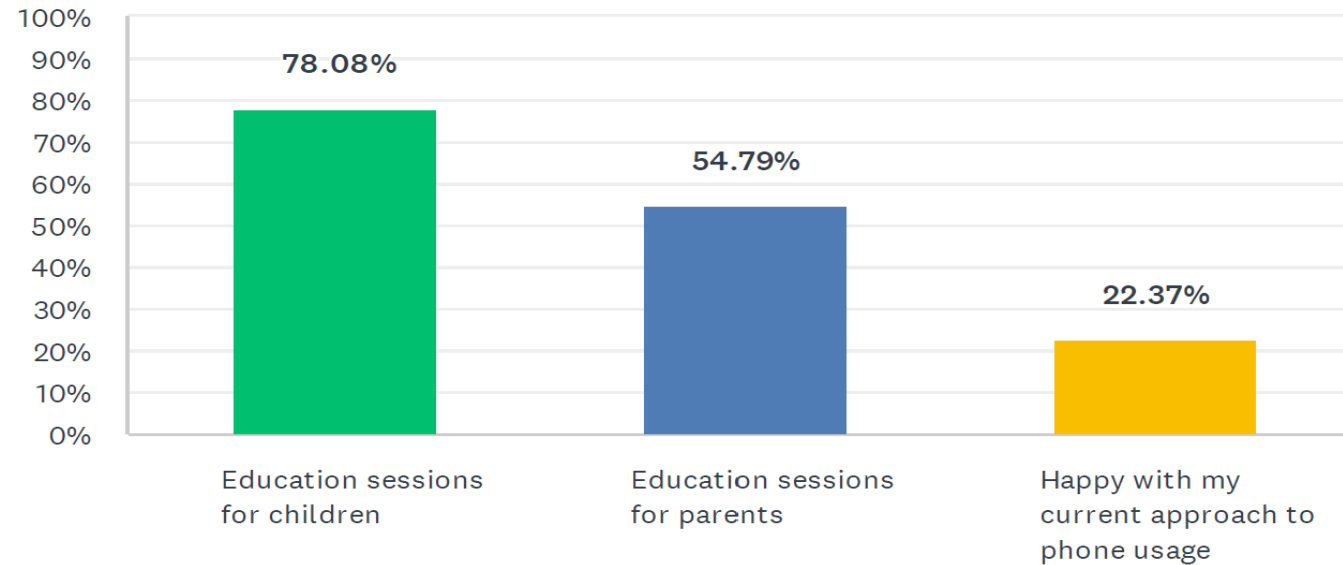
